

These achievements by ANU have served as the foundations for ANU's development. In the future, ANU will continue in its efforts to foster human resources of moral character and physical abilities on these foundations.

Half the Registration Fees of Private Universities, One of the Lowest of All National Universities in Korea

ANU has lowered its registration fees for the last three years consecutively. The average registration fees of ANU in 2014 is 1,850,000 won per semester, which is half the registration fees of private universities. The fees for colleges of humanities and social sciences are in the range of 1,500,000 won. This level of fees of ANU is one of the lowest of all national universities in Korea. ANU's registration fees in 2013 was found to be the third lowest of the 27 national universities in Korea. ANU does its social duty as a national university, leading in its efforts to make a studying environment enabling students to work hard without any concerns about registration fees. ANU does its best for students to enjoy more benefits.

Won the Evaluation Accreditation for University Organizations

ANU was granted 'the 2013 Evaluation Accreditation for University Organizations' by Korean University Accreditation Institute attached to the Korean Council for University Education. The institute is authorized as an organization of university accreditation by the Ministry of Education. ANU was officially recognized for its excellent quality of education by this evaluation accreditation. In addition, this recognition is sure to raise ANU's competitiveness and serve as a lasting foundation for ANU's development.

Nursing Department Newly Established: First Recruitment of Freshmen in 2015

ANU's newly established Nursing Department will cultivate nursing professionals of ability and moral character who are grounded in the community. ANU is expected to recruit 40 freshmen from the academic year 2015. ANU can educate nursing professionals, who will be able to provide a high level of dedicated and professional medical services. In the future, ANU plans to concentrate on developing the department into a faculty of health and welfare.



ANU's Support Programs for Job Searching

Operation of the Job Searching Subject

ANU operates a course of career development units so that from the time they enter ANU, students can explore various job worlds, decide on a career course, systematically develop and manage their own experiences, and finally find a job in their field when they graduate.

Career Development Program

This program is intended to help students to grow and develop, systematically manage their campus life and experiences, and decide on their career. By building a system called MSP (My Success Plan), this program helps students to create a Road Map and to put it into practice. This system accumulates and turns students' individual experiences into their own mileage. By connecting their accumulated information with their educational records managed by the university headquarters, and the certification system of engineering education, this program manages students' experiences during their school life and makes it available for their job search.

Counseling for Life and Career Courses

The counseling office of the Support Center for Students' Career and Job Searching advises students about mental health, school work, and interpersonal relations. In addition, this office conducts various psychological tests, counseling, job seeking lectures in cooperation with various departments, and group counseling about career and job seeking along with promotion of these programs. This center also hosts a contest for job seeking road maps. As seen above, this office focuses on ANU students' career and job search.





ANU's Certification for Customized Job Searching: ANUCS Certification

The system of ANUCS Certification is intended to foster customized talents suitable for social needs. This certification is given to those who meet certain standards in various areas such as academic achievements, foreign language ability, ability to utilize Chinese characters, and capacity for information technology, and those who participate in volunteering activities, and complete a course in ethics. Those awarded this certification are also granted various benefits. This program is unique to ANU.





ANU's International Exchange Programs

Exchange Program for Students

ANU operates a program for its students to study for a certain amount of time (six months to one year) at universities overseas while they are enrolled, and to have their overseas studies credited towards their degree. This program provides students with broad educational opportunities for experiencing advanced learning and foreign cultures and expanding their views. It is expected that the number of countries and students participating in this program will gradually increase.

Program for Dual Degrees

ANU operates a dual degree program, which enables students to get two degrees awarded by ANU and the foreign university concerned when they meet the requirements set by academic exchange agreements to strengthen foreign language education. The students spend two years studying at ANU and two years at a foreign university. Currently, Chinese Culture University in Taiwan is participating in this dual degree program.

Exchange Program for Students with Sister Universities in China

ANU operates an exchange program for students with sister universities in China. This program is intended to help students to learn Chinese and experience Chinese Culture. Students study at a Chinese university for a certain amount of time (six months to one year), and credits achieved at these Chinese universities are accepted by ANU. The number of credits that can be taken in Chinese sister universities is a maximum of forty-two a year (seventy for two years). The credits taken at the sister university are acceptable as those for majors or general electives at ANU. ANU students, who are properly qualified, can study at five sister universities in China.

Diplomatic Roles for International Exchanges

Students who take diplomatic roles for international exchanges help foreign students who are studying at ANU to adapt to Korean life by helping them to adjust and providing support. They project a positive and friendly image of Korea to the foreign students at ANU, and serve as facilitators in various events related to international exchanges. These students experience foreign cultures and at the same time participate in volunteering activities. Every year, fifteen students at ANU play these roles of diplomats by doing volunteering services for international exchange events.

Excellent Students' Language Training in Foreign Countries

ANU selects excellent students and has them participate in language training during their vacations in order for them to cultivate a global mind set and develop language skills. The students selected are sent to designated countries to participate in language training for four to six weeks. Students participating in language training overseas take advantage of homestay programs or university dormitories provided by the university. Through this language training program, students experience various cultures and develop language skills.

Information on Studying at ANU for Foreign Students

Introduction to Foreign Students' Admission

Andong National University recruits foreign students for the undergraduate course as freshmen or transfer students and also for graduate schools for master's and doctoral courses. The university also runs a Korean language course.


- 1. Undergraduate Course
 - Time: On a specified day in May and November each year
 - Qualifications for freshman admission
 - Korean residents in foreign countries or foreigners with educational backgrounds of graduation from regular high schools or more in Korea or other foreign countries
 - 2) Foreigners at level 3 or more in TOPIK (Test of Proficiency in Korean)
 - Qualifications for transfer admission: the same qualifications as in undergraduate course
 - Those who have completed two years' undergraduate course in Korea or overseas
 - 2) Those who have completed courses at two-year junior colleges, higher level institutions, or at equivalent educational organizations in Korea or overseas and have attained degrees or are expected to attain degrees
- 2. Graduate Course (for Master's and Doctoral Degree)
 - Time: On a specified day in May and November each year
 - Common Requirements: Foreign students, Korean residents in foreign countries, or foreigners who have completed courses equivalent to the college or university
 - Master's Course: Those who have completed regular courses of college or university in Korea or overseas, and have attained or are expected to attain Bachelor's degrees.
 - Doctoral Course: Those who have completed regular courses of college or university in Korea or overseas, and have attained or are expected to attain Master's degrees.
- 3. Korean Language Program
 - Opening: on a specified day in March and September each year
 - Foreigners who graduated from regular high school or a higher level of educational organizations
 - Class: forty weeks (800 hours) per year with 20 weeks' basic course and 20 weeks' intermediate course divided
 - This course is intended for foreigners who would like to learn Korean. This
 course also provides opportunities for learning Korean culture and tradition.

Supporting and Affiliated Facilities

Library

The library aims to offer a user-centered service and provides access to domestic and overseas academic journals and electronic media for faculty, students, and local residents. The library has about 1,500 seats for pleasant and comfortable reading, and it operates various attached facilities such as group study room, book cafe, etc. to provide resting and learning space together. Eventually, the library's goal is to become a ubiquitous library that the users can access from anywhere at anytime. The library takes the role of the academic information center as the representative national university in Gyeongbuk province leading the knowledge-based society.



Dormitory

ANU is proud of its accommodation for students, which is equipped with cutting-edge information systems and modern facilities. In addition, boarding expenses are very low. The male-only Solmoe-gwan (Hall) can accommodate 775 students, and the female only Garam-gwan (Hall) can hold 896 students. The Solbit-gwan (Hall) for high achieving students can accept 382 students. The dormitories on campus can accommodate 2053 students in all, which is a fairly high accommodation rate in Korea. To speak of freshman students, all the female freshman students who want to reside in the dormitory can be accepted, and 80% of the male students who want to dwell in the dormitory can be accepted. In fact, ANU has an objective to accommodate 100% of those freshman students who apply to live in the dormitory.

ANU Institute for Education Development

This institute was founded in July, 2005 to help improve the educational capacity of Andong National University. In response to the open and information-oriented trend of this age, this institute supports the development of educational activities, emphasizing the improvement of offline and on-line teaching-learning methods and the reinforcement of ANU's educational capacity. In particular, the institute develops and operates various educational programs through the teaching-learning department (teacher learning support team, e-Learning support team), the liberal arts education department, and the department of educational courses. In addition, Smart-LMS, which supports and manages the on-line teaching-learning environment, has been introduced and operated to keep pace with the smart era.

Information & Communication Center

The center has constructed ultrahigh-speed electronic networks and radio Internet, and offers a fully connected ubiquitous environment. It plays important roles in university computerization: educating students in computers, supporting teaching and research, and providing on-line administrative business.



Language Center

The language center focuses on language education intended to improve language skills and develop linguistic culture. With experts of foreign language education and excellent education environment, various courses and classes on foreign languages are offered, such as English, Japanese and Chinese. The center also trains elementary and secondary school English teachers. This center performs the work of translation and proofreading, and other various academic activities related to language.

ANU Media Center

The goal of ANU Media Center is forming upright public opinion within the university and creating university culture through the students' freedom of the press. The center consists of the ANU Newspaper, the AUBS and the ANU English Newspaper.

Business Incubation Center

The Business Incubation Center is intended to increase the possibilities of success in founding a business, and to contribute to the expansion of industrial foundation and the industrial revitalization in the region. To reach these goals, the center provides comprehensive support for businesses in their initial stage of foundation. The center helps prospective business persons who have creative ideas and techniques for businesses but who have difficulty in securing a business space or facilities. The center incubates those businesses or prospective entrepreneurs for a certain period, and provides them with a business site, various kinds of information and communication infrastructure, shared mechanical facilities, and guidance in management, taxation, and technology. The center will try to operate the system of incubation service more solidly, and do its best to lead those incubated businesses and the small and medium businesses in the region to grow into stronger ventures and secure their competitiveness.



Industry-Academic Cooperation Center for Small and Medium Enterprises

This center is provided with funds by the national government (the Small and Medium Business Administration) and the local government (Gyeongbuk Province). By utilizing the excellent research power, and research & development equipment and facilities of ANU, this center solves technical problems occurring at the production sites of small and medium businesses, and helps improve the processes of production. It also



develops new technology and new products and improves the performance of the products. Through various projects such as the project of supporting joint technology development between industries and universities, the project of attaching institutes to industries, and the project of supporting the shared use of research equipment between industries and universities, this center contributes to intensifying the competitiveness of small and medium businesses, and revitalizing the regional economy.

ROTC

ROTC stands for Reserve Officers' Training Corps, and it is a collegebased officer program that cultivates new elite officers who have undergone physical and military education after selected from ROTC applicants. Andong National University ROTC was founded in 1992, and it has cultivated more than 600 new elite second lieutenants since. Andong National University ROTC has achieved numerous awards such as "The Best ROTC for 2009 Summer Enlisted Training", "The Best in Overall Commission Evaluation", and "Overall Excellent ROTC for 2011 Winter Enlisted Training." Producing new elite officers with a proper set of values, characters, personality, and excellent qualifications is the goal of ANU ROTC, and in order to become one of the best ROTC in the country, the drill instructors and trainees work as one. In 2014, there are 32 trainees for the 53rd class and 33 trainees for the 54th class total of 65 trainees including 9 female trainees. This is the highest acceptance rate in Daegu-Gyeongbook region, and this year 5 female applicants have passed the second screening process for the 55th class, and are waiting for the final acceptance.

Lifelong Education Center

This center opens and operates various courses: hobby classes, practical classes, and courses fitting in with regional characteristics for the residents to participate in. In accordance with 'a society of open learning and continuing education,' the center provides various learning opportunities for the residents in the region. Some courses issue certificates to those who complete the courses. These services further contribute to open education.

Sports Center

The Sports Center has been established to provide lifelong education not only to the university members but also to the local residents. This center expanded the university's basic infrastructure space, and has a golf driving range (60 boxes), swimming pool (adults' pool with 6 lanes 25m long, kids' pool with 2 lanes 19m long), fitness center (40 fitness equipments), GX room (table tennis and yoga). About 40 lifelong education courses as well as major and elective courses of the physical education department are held here to enhance the fitness of university members and local residents by providing a health culture space. All the staff work together as one and put their utmost effort into providing the best educational service and customer satisfaction with continuous innovation.



Confucius Institute

This institute is a Chinese culture and language education center which has been co-established by Andong National University and Qufu Normal University with the support of Hanban and Confucius Institute Headquarters of China. Chinese native teachers instruct Chinese classes and take charge of cultural and academic exchange programs. In addition, this institute conducts official HSK/HSKK exams, provides opportunities for language studies or cultural visits to China, and selects scholarship students for Confucius Institute Headquarters. Overall, it supports both Andong National University students' and locals' going into China.

Solmoe Culture Hall

Solmoe Culture Hall is an all-around, multi-purpose cultural site where people can enjoy various kinds of events: musical performances for graduation, academic presentations by various departments, musical performances by faculty members, graduation exhibitions of fine arts, dancing presentations, movie screening, domestic and international academic seminars, presentation of plays, concerts, and celebrity lectures. This hall satisfies the residents' needs for cultural life, and also supports the activities of the faculty, staff members, and students of ANU.

Andong English Village

Andong English Village has been founded with the cooperation of Andong City, Andong Office of Education Support, and Andong National University. It is equipped with various facilities for students to experience situations -- such as departure and arrival -- that could take place while traveling or studying abroad. The various situations that one could meet in English-speaking countries are shown in 21 situational spaces, and regular and special programs using experiential facilities are prepared. Every week, eighty elementary and middle school students are admitted to the village (2,400 students a year), participating in regular programs for three nights and four days. This English village greatly contributes to meeting the intellectual curiosity of the students and improving the educational competitive power of the region.



Museum

Since 1979, the museum has investigated, collected, researched, and displayed tangible and intangible materials concerned with archaeology, history and folklore, and contributed to the students' learning and the faculty's research. It is equipped with a video room and a room which overlooks Yeokdongseowon. The video room shows 'the letter written by Won's mom,' and the hemp shoes called Mituri which are known to the world through the National Geographic issue of November, 2007. The permanent exhibition room displays 'The History and Culture of Andong' from the prehistoric period to the modern age in a systematic way, enabling visitors to easily understand the exhibition.

Yeokdongseowon

Yeokdongseowon was built to commemorate WOO Tak, the mentor of the seowon and to educate confucian scholars. This is a cultural heritage of Korea that enables its visitors to learn about Korean history and tradition. It offers visitors opportunities to feel the virtues of the mentor and to reinterpret Korean culture and tradition, and contributes to the advancement of Korean studies.


Students' Club Activities



Hahoe Village

Important Cultural Asset No. 122. It is a representative village for the Pungsan Ryu family. The village name Hahoe (Ha means a river and Hoe means turning around) originates from the fact that the Nakdong-gang river flows around the village in an S shape. Low hills of the mountain range stretch to the western part of the village. The Nakdong-gang river that flows in front, Buyongdae rock cliff, sandy shore and dense pine forest create a magnificent view. Hahoe Byeolsingut Mask Dance Drama, and Seonyujulbul Nori are still preserved in the village, so it is the most suitable traditional folk village to understand the traditional culture of Andong. The village was listed as a UNESCO World Heritage site on July 31st, 2010.



Dosanseowon

Historical Site No. 170. This academy was built to celebrate and commemorate the scholarship and virtue of Toegye LEE Hwang who was called Haedongjooja and to educate Confucian scholars. From a structural viewpoint, the academy is divided into Dosanseodang and Dosanseowon. Dosanseodang is the place where Toegye personally taught his followers, whereas Dosanseodang was built after his passing. In 1575 (in the eighth year of King Seonjo) the building became a saaekseowon, in accordance with the tablet hand-written by HAN Seokbong, the most notable calligrapher of the day. The academy consists of Jeongyodang, Sangdeoksa, Dosanseodang, Nongunjeongsa, Gwangmyeongsil, Jangpangak, etc. Andong lake is located in front and a dense pine forest surrounds its back, so one can feel charm and lyricism.



Wolyeonggyo

It is the biggest and longest wooden bridge in Korea (length: 387m, width: 3.6m). It was named by collecting citizens' opinions: from the submerged Wolyeongdae, which was moved here due to Andong dam construction and from its place name, Eumdamgol, Wolgok-myeon. A fountain is installed on the bridge, and one can enjoy the whole view of the dam from Palgakjeong which is located in the middle of the bridge.



Byeongsanseowon

Historical Site No. 260. At first, this seowon was located in Pungsan-hyeon with the name of "Pungakseodang." Master Seoae RYU Seongryong moved it to the present location in 1572 (fifth year of King Seonjo) for training Confucian scholars. In 1614 (fifth year of King Gwanghaegun), local Confucian scholars built a shrine for him and started Hyangsa (memorial ceremony) praising the mentor's achievements and deep studies. It has become a prestigious seowon since then. Byeongsanseowon faces a rock cliff crossing over Hwasan from Hahoe village. It is famous for its vista and excellent architecture. The seowon consists of Ipgyodang, Jondeoksa, Jangpangak, Mandaeru pavillion overlooking Nakdong-gang river, and Gwangyoungji. Byeongsanseowon is famous for preserving the typical shape of a seowon.
